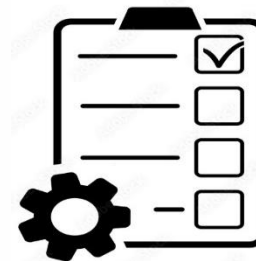

Recap of the April 2024 discussion

- At the ATI mid-year meeting on April 12, 2024, the Steering Committee (SC) discussed the updated operating procedures, which is at the heart of the ATI operations.
- The SC broadly agreed on the proposed changes - *all ATI member countries, and not only contributing members, would be members of the SC.*
- Discussions revolved around the costs to ATI for inviting additional members and whether this would impact on course delivery. ATI confirmed that the proposed changes would have no impact on course delivery.

Background

- **Operating procedures** have been in place since 2014. The procedures provide guidance on the ATI governance through the SC.
- **Role of the SC:** the SC provides strategic guidance, helps with setting priorities, and endorses the annual work plan and annual report. The SC holds an annual meeting, and interim meetings as necessary.
- It is appropriate to **update the procedures** to ensure the operations under **Phase III**, guided by the SC, reflect the needs of ATI stakeholders.



Enhance Inclusivity and Ownership

- Governance and financing have evolved over the decade.
- Increased number of **contributing member countries**
- **Virtual or hybrid SC meeting modality** becoming more common



- **All member countries** are now invited to SC meetings to provide inputs and take part in discussions, aiming to enhance **inclusivity** and member country **ownership**.

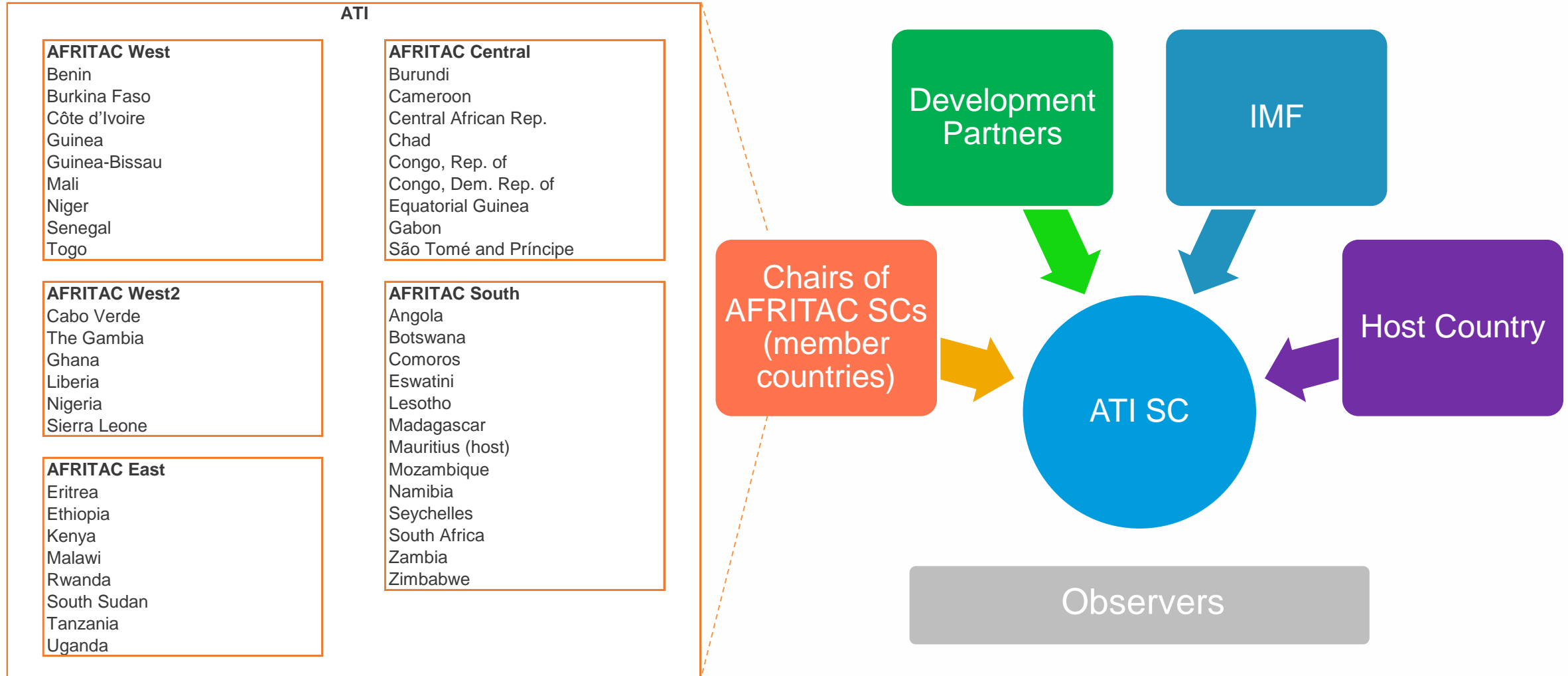

Proposed Changes in SC Decisions

- **Retain a constituency arrangement** organized in line with the membership of the AFRITACs to manage the **decision-making process** in the enlarged SC.
 - **Decisions by consensus among principal members** (member countries via the chairs of the AFRITAC SCs).
 - The chairs of AFRITAC SCs shall communicate beforehand with member countries in their respective constituencies.
 - Outside of the SC meetings, decisions via email among the principal members for lapse-of-time endorsement.
- These proposed changes are sought for official endorsement at this meeting and will become effective immediately.
